Annual Fall Fundraiser is the Gift that Keeps on Giving

SANTA CRUZ, Calif., – September 30, 2010 – When something works, the news spreads exponentially. That is what is happening throughout Santa Cruz County as more and more children, adults, mentors and families learn effective ways to respond to stressful situations and inner turmoil.

It started fall of 2009 with the vision and conviction of Sheri and Jeff Moise, co-owners of Johnny's Harborside, who wanted to give back to their community by sponsoring local teachers to attend the Resilient Educator Program developed by the Institute of HeartMath[®].

Moise says that, "We wanted to do something for kids that would help them feel less anxious about the world around them. We have two teenage sons and know first hand the stress and angst they (and us) often experience in school and out of school. We felt that if we helped teachers learn to deal with their own stress – they would ultimately help our kids on many different levels." Increasingly, emotional a lack of self-regulation is being recognized as a key factor working with at risk kids. Programs and agencies such as the Foster & Kinship Care Education Program at Cabrillo and Santa Cruz County Office of Education have turned to the Institute of HeartMath to help them deal with challenging behaviors and clients in need of emotional regulation.

Michael Paynter, Santa Cruz County Office of Education, Project Coordinator for Alternative Education, received a scholarship from Johnny's 2009 Fall Fundraiser to participate in the HeartMath Resilient Educator Program. "My primary reason for wanting to go through the HeartMath training was to learn their highly successful techniques for helping at-risk students. Theses students need to develop a skill which could help them at critical times become more coherent/clear-minded/less triggered and therefore make better decisions about crucial topics such as drug use, un-safe sex, fighting, defiant behavior in the class. This program was so effective we are now using it in eight different programs throughout the County. I have been so impressed with the results we are seeing that I recommended the HeartMath program to Deborah Helms," said Paynter.

Deborah L Helms, Foster & Kinship Care Education Program Director at Cabrillo College states that "one of the biggest difficulties we face when working with at-risk kids, in particular, those who were heavily exposed to drug and alcohol and drug is selfregulation. We believed that an effective way to address this is to number one, ensure that our cadre of Kinship Caregivers is healthy and balanced so they can be good mentors to the kids and that's why we're working with HeartMath."

"When we I hear about all the teachers, agencies and kids that, because of us, feel more balanced are less stressed and happier, it makes me feel like we really did make a difference and that makes it all worth it," said Sheri Moise.

The 2010 Johnny's Harborside "Heart for Kids' Sake" Fundraiser was launched on September 21. Funds raised will sponsor a Big Brothers Big Sisters' representative to be trained and certified to deliver, free of charge, the Institute of HeartMath's DeStress Workshop to Big Brother Big Sister volunteers, mentors, families and agency participants. Learning how to cope with emotional turbulence and stressful situations is a significant life-skill that Big Brothers Big Sisters mentors will give to the kids they assist.

Johnny's Haborside will donate a portion of their sales of Rodney Strong Vineyards wine September 23, 2010 – January 1, 2011. In addition, funds will be raised during a special Rodney Strong Wine dinner to be held at Johnny's Haborside on Thursday November 11th. It will be a six-course dinner with wine pairings.
